# **Executive Director's Report**

# **State and Provincial Reports**

# Washington

Greetings from Washington State. Time is marching on and spring will be here before we know it. Here are a few of the highlights shared with me about what's going on around the state:

**Franklin County (from Andrew Sage):** Franklin County Mosquito Control District completed a second successful year of UAS operations, treating over 3000 acres of larval habitat, with the addition of a second drone. This is, of course, in addition to the traditional means of Mosquito Abatement that is still appropriate to non-UAS friendly environments in Franklin County. FCMCD also held the Inaugural Drone Roundtable in Pasco, WA after the start of the 2022 new year, and will host another Drone Roundtable in 2023. FCMCD would like to thank all those districts and persons that were able to attend the Drone Roundtable that yielded great discussion and information this year. 2021 was a successful year using an IPM strategy that is paying off for so many of us. FCMCD is looking forward to the future and what it might bring to IPM in the PNW.

Benton County (from Angela Beehler): Kevin Shoemaker has been working on the pollinator language in WA's new pesticide penalty matrix. We are concerned that additional penalties for harming pollinators could be misconstrued and that mosquito control programs could be subject to additional scrutiny if the proposed language stands. Angela Beehler testified on Thursday, Feb. 17<sup>th</sup>, asking for a mosquito control exemption on a proposed law requiring all public entities to purchase emission-free equipment. (blowers, foggers, chainsaws). Additionally, Angela spoke with Ecology employees about the use of Pyriproxyfen, which is not listed on our NPDES permits, and she believes we are okay using it according to the label, because the application sites should not be Waters of the United States, therefore those applications are not subject to NPDES permitting requirements.

Adams County: We completed our first year with a surveillance and an application drone. I was blown away by how much each was able to accomplish. 68% of our total acreage in 2021 was treated by the drone, blowing away my expectations. I'm grateful to the local districts who are also starting drone programs and are so willing to discuss and share ideas. The drone roundtable organized by Andrew Sage in Pasco in January was excellent and I'm glad there are plans for another in 2023. I also appreciated Steve Ingalls at Benton County getting local districts together in December to compare notes. I always learn a lot at these get togethers.

For those who haven't seen it or had the chance, here is a link to the 2021 PESP Survey that was sent out by Chris Law in early February. The deadline for responses is March 13. This survey allows for sharing and collaboration of mosquito control districts across the country which benefits each of us.

# **Oregon**

The 2021 mosquito season in Oregon was an interesting one. Due to the severe drought throughout the state, many districts reported seeing less mosquito activity than normal. Due to most of the state suffering from severe or extreme drought, much of the larval habitats dried up earlier than usual. WNv activity was more active compared to the year before, particularly in Baker & Morrow counties. All of the WNv activity was in the eastern & southern portions of the state. Many districts also reported difficulties filling their seasonal positions.

Looking ahead to next season, the snow water equivalent percentages are varied throughout the state. Southern Oregon is tracking around 75%, with conditions improving the further north you go. Hopefully winter is not over yet and we get some more snow in February and March. I look forward to the NWMVCA spring meeting. It will be great to see everyone again in person and not through a computer screen. Enjoy what is left of the offseason!
